10th Sacerdotal Anniversary – Fr Lourdusamy Prasanna



REMEMBERING POPE FRANCIS & INSTALLATION OF HIS SUCCESSOR

Remembering Pope Francis



Sun 04 May marks the last day of the 9-day mourning for our Holy Father, Pope Francis. During this nine-days of mourning (knowns as the Novendiales), we have offered prayers for our Holy Father at all Masses. May his soul rest in peace. Please do continue to pray for him.

Pray for the Conclave (Wed 07 May @ 7.30 pm)

Cardinal William Goh has appealed for our prayers as the College of Cardinals enter into the Conclave on 7 May to elect a new Pope. He highlighted that "it is urgent and important that you all pray for us so that we can discern what kind of Pope the Church needs in this present day".

The Conclave will be held within the Sistine Chapel. After each vote, the ballot papers are burned. If white smoke is emitted from the chapel chimney, it will mean that a new Pope has been selected. Let heed His Eminence's request to pray fervently so that the Cardinals will "be guided by the Holy Spirit to elect a good, holy, compassionate, wise and strong pope who will not only be a Shepherd after the heart of Christ, but also courageous in defending the deposit of Faith handed down to the Church through the ages."

On Wed 07 May, we will gather as usual for our First Wed Mass and this Mass will be dedicated to for this purpose. We will have our Rosary to St Joseph at 7.30 pm followed by Mass. Please join us in prayer as we each have a responsibility to pray for the successor of St Peter.

Our 180th Anniversary (2026) Series – "St Joseph: Model of All Who Work" Article 6

Outposts of our parish

St Joseph's Church in Bukit Timah (SJCBT) managed six outposts for a hundred years through Missions Étrangères de Paris (MEP) and local priests because of evangelical opportunities in other locations in Singapore and Johore.

The first outpost was in 1862 in Boo Koo Kang, five kilometres from Bukit Timah. Chinese Christians, who found Bukit Timah not conducive to plant muscatel nuts, ventured into Boo Koo Kang to farm banana, indigo and sugar cane. Parish priest Fr Augustin Perie also bought land opposite Johore as he saw an opportunity to reach out to Chinese settlers in Malaya from the outpost. Naming the outpost Sainte Marie, he built a chapel, a hall for catechism classes and a room for MEP missionaries to rest before spreading the faith in Johore. Fr Perie visited the outpost on Thursdays for catechism and on Sundays to celebrate Mass. The chapel was destroyed within a year, with secret societies blaming a pagan for burning the grass nearby.

The second outpost was naturally in Johore. Since some SJCBT Chinese Christians had settled in Johore because of the better soil condition, Fr Perie looked for his flock in Pontian in 1864, but he faced numerous problems such as continued threats from secret societies and lack of commitment from his original supporters. The Chinese pagans did not want to join the mission because Fr Perie forbade gambling and opium. When Fr Perie left the outpost and SJCBT in 1865 to evangelise in another Johore location, Ayer Hitam, parish priest Fr Jean-Marie Remes managed SJCBT and the Pontian outpost. Fr Remes built a proper chapel in 1867, dedicating it to St Francis Xavier. Fr Perie returned to SJCBT and Pontian between 1868-1870 but returned to France in 1870 for medical treatment. Between 1870-1873, parish priests Fr Marie Francois Issaly and Fr Elisee Delouette looked after the outpost but when Fr Issaly died from illness, Fr Delouette closed the outpost in 1873.

The third outpost was the St Anthony of Padua Chapel in Mandai Village, where Fr Stephen Lee from the Town Mission had obtained land to house migrant Swatow Chinese Catholics in 1927. Teochew-speaking parish priest Fr Romuald De Rozario supported the outpost by financing a catechist, a sacristan and two teachers. After the war, parish priest Fr Joachim Teng visited the outpost on Sundays. With Mandai baptisms reaching 242 between 1951-1960, Fr Teng built a larger church in 1960 from funds donated and it became a separate parish in 1965. In 1994, the Church of St Anthony was built in Woodlands due to government resettlement plans.

The fourth outpost was in Tuas Jurong. Many Chinese settlers had shifted from different parts of Singapore to the Tuas fishing village to make a living in the 1940s. Since it was too far to travel from Jurong to Bukit Timah, the community requested for a Catholic priest. Fr Rozario visited the Jurong Catholics from 1944 and celebrated monthly Masses in 1948. From 1949, Fr Teng looked after the outpost and in 1958 obtained land for a chapel. He dedicated the chapel to Our Lady of Fatima and handed the parish over to the Franciscan Friars, who then developed the St Francis of Assisi parish and the St Mary of the Angels parish.

The fifth outpost was the Seletar Naval Base Chapel, Our Lady Queen of Peace, which became the Church of the Star of the Sea as an outstation of the Church of Our Lady of Lourdes (COLL). There was shared jurisdiction for this outpost: SJCB looked after the Chinese Catholics while COLL served the Indian Catholics. From 1947 to the 1950s, first under Fr Rozario and then Fr Joachim Teng, SJCBT recorded baptisms from Naval Base.

The sixth outpost was the Tengah Air Base chapel, St Michael and All Angels. Fr Teng looked after the spiritual needs of the Catholics there between the 1940s and 1960s but the chapel was abandoned when British forces pulled out in the 1970s.

SJCBT had helped to spread the Catholic faith to different locations in Singapore and Malaya!




